TO PROVIDE CATHOLIC EDUCATION FOCUSED ON DOCTRINE, TRADITION, VALUES, AND MORALS

1. To offer a regular class to upper grade students which focuses on age-appropriate ethical dilemmas that will aid their conscience formation and decision making process.
2. To expand our involvement with Feed My Starving Children.
3. To allow more children the opportunity to actively participate in school liturgies.

TO PROVIDE OPTIMUM TECHNOLOGY INSTRUCTION

1. Teachers will expand the assessment and skill reinforcement of students via technology (specifically with additional Quia accounts) to provide a variety of ways to evaluate student learning.
2. To utilize SKYPE as a means of enhancing classroom instruction by allowing input and dialogue from experts in the field.
3. To better inform jr. high parents by providing an online weekly progress report in core subjects.
4. To provide K-5 teachers with additional visual interactive technology, such as the Smartboard or Elmo.
5. To provide monthly mini in-services to the faculty and parents to keep them abreast of the newest technology, such as Web 2.0

TO CONTINUE DEVELOPMENT OF EXCELLENCE IN CURRICULUM & INSTRUCTION

1. To explore a framework for curriculum mapping in order to improve communication and instruction all areas of the curriculum.
2. To explore the possibility of adding a second foreign language or expanding Spanish to the lower grades.
3. To provide more structured enrichment for our truly accelerated students.

TO PROVIDE RELEVANT AND TIMELY COMMUNICATIONS TO FAMILIES

1. To investigate a way of communicating electronically with parents as to their children's daily academic and social progress.

2. To convert all school forms to a PDF to allow parents to complete on their computer screen.
3. To standardize information to be made available on teacher web pages – standards to reflect both school developmental levels and subject.
4. To educate our parents on the advantages of a Catholic education.
5. To better inform younger parents as to the scope and variety of our instruction.
